Nothing is more important in the life of the church than the worship of Almighty God. During the months of November and December, there will be increased opportunities to come before the Lord with thanksgiving and praise.

Some worship opportunities continue a long tradition at SHPC:

The Ecumenical Thanksgiving service which will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal, 4051 Old Shell Rd, on Thursday, November 20 at 6:30 PM

The Advent Cantata *Magnificat: The Song of Mary* presented by choir and chamber orchestra on Sunday, December 14 at 10:30 AM

The Christmas *Lessons and Carols* service led by the Chancel Choir on Christmas Eve, Wednesday, December 24 at 6 PM.

Other worship opportunities have long histories in the church, but are new to SHPC:

Hanging of the Greens is a service of worship in which we prepare our worship space for the Advent/Christmas season and the coming of the Christ Child through wreaths, garlands and trees. Each piece of greenery carries a specific meaning within the Christian tradition, and the members will take part in bringing those pieces forward. Why do we use pine, fir, holly and ivy? Come and find out! The service takes place at 5:30 PM on Sunday, November 23

Wholeness and Healing services. These services take place on the third Sunday of each month at 5:30 PM in the chapel with the next service taking place on November 16. Two services have been held so far with increased attendance at the second service. Join us to find out why this service is so meaningful for those in attendance.

Finally, we have two concert opportunities that you won't want to miss:

Never on a Sunday (but still on a Sunday!) – My first concert since arriving in Mobile. Light classical to pops on my virtual pipe organ. It will take place in the Fellowship Hall on November 9 at 2 PM. We will have refreshments!

Christmas Pops – We will return to the Fellowship Hall on December 7 at 2 PM with a pops concert featuring Christmas vocal, piano, and organ selections for the whole family. (We might even have refreshments again!)

Pastoral Care Intern

We are happy to announce that Owen Drey will be joining the ministry team of Spring Hill Presbyterian Church as a Pastoral Care Intern where he will offer compassionate presence, support and spiritual care to members and friends of the congregation. This internship is part of Owen's Board Certification as a Chaplain through the Association of Clinical Pastoral Education which has become the standard for those serving in healthcare, hospice, education and military chaplaincy. Owen completed his first clini-

cal rotation as a System Chaplain Intern with the USA Health system serving at USA Medical Center, USA Children's and Women's Hospital, USA Providence Hospital and the USA Mitchell Cancer Institute.

Owen grew up at Spring Hill Presbyterian and is the son of longtime member, Barbara Drey. . Owen attended St. Paul's Episcopal School, Auburn University, USA and the Cumberland School of Law before heading to Washington, DC to make a difference in the world. Owen attended Georgetown Presbyterian Church where he was ordained and served on the Board of Deacons.

Upon moving to Virginia he attended The Protestant Episcopal Theological Seminary in Virginia (VTS) to study and serve as a theologically trained lay person in the world. In addition to serving as a Lay Eucharistic Minister and on the Mana Foodbank board in his community, Owen conducted his master's thesis research on The Church in the World and later served in mission work throughout east and Central Africa.

Upon returning to Mobile, he worked in the legal field and Owen's most current legal practice has focused on human, civil and prisoner's rights.

Owen has been married to Kathryn Wilburn Drey for more than 20 years, has three wonderful step-daughters, two grand-children, and his son, Gaines is a freshman at the University of Alabama, his beloved grandmother, Barbara's/Gigi's alma mater. 
