RADICAL GRATITUDE

DEAR SPRING HILL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FAMILY,

As I write this letter I am still reveling in joy and appreciation for our recent Festival of Faith. Seeing so many of our members spread around the Mobile community in acts of service and compassion was powerful. Some of us donated blood at our blood drive, and some of us packed food at Feeding the Gulf Coast. Some of us served meals to the homeless at the Government Street Coffee Club, and some of us served pizza to our preschoolers. Some of us cleaned up a park through Mobile Baykeeper, and some of us beautified the grounds and visited residents at Allen Memorial Home. All of us (whether we participated in one of these projects or not) were reflecting the love of Christ in our community as a truly serving church.

Also, over this recent Festival of Faith, we welcomed Dr. Robert Williamson who used the book of Revelation to open our eyes to some of the death-dealing ways of the empires of our world, and to our calling as the Church to be a counter-cultural community of life and light. It was powerful! There were four responses that Dr. Williamson outlined for what we as Christians are called to do: 1) speak to and point to the truth, 2) worship the crucified and risen lord, 3) create opportunities, spaces, and relationships where God's resurrecting love can be experienced, and 4) endure in the faith together. This vision for the church as a community of faithful resistances is one that I hope we will reflect on and wrestle with for years to come.

As we conclude our season of Lent and move forward together into the events of "Holy Week," it is important to remember that our calling as Christians (lived out in those four actions) is first and foremost grounded not in what we do, but in who Christ is and what Christ has already done for us. Christ's death and resurrection for us is the ultimate and triumphant act of resistance to the death-dealing empires of the world. In these cosmos-changing events our salvation is accomplished for us and we are opened up to the truth that death does not have the final word and that the systems and institutions that do not participate in God's life-giving love, will ultimately fail. There is a deep and profound freedom that comes from this truth, and it is one that, among other things,



engenders a sense of awe, wonder, and radical gratitude for God's grace. So, in these days ahead I hope you will join with your church family and gather together to worship the one who "was crucified, dead, and buried" and "on the third day rose again from the dead." May that worship not be restricted to a few actions once a week, but may it blossom and flourish in lives of gratitude, mercy, sacrifice, and hospitality.

I am deeply grateful for this community of faith, and the ways that we experience hope and resurrection life together in our midst. Thanks be to God!

Remembering Who is in Charge.

Dear Friends,

In this season, you might be feeling pressure. For our children and youth, maybe it's pressure to get good grades, be the best soccer player, dancer, or artist. For our working folk, maybe it's getting the raise or supporting your family. For the church maybe it's growth. All of these are good pursuits, important pursuits. Yet how quickly can they be manipulated into something that is all-consuming and life-squelching— when we forget to take Sabbath because we have to meet that deadline—and there's always a deadline: when our children and youth are overwhelmed by anxiety because of the pressure to make the grades, get into the right school, and "succeed."

Our Festival of Faith speaker, Bobby Williamson has got me thinking that maybe we are focused on the wrong things. We have become enslaved by powers that are not healthy, that are all-consuming. We worship success or growth or possessions at the cost of our own humanity. In this season of Lent, we are called to stop. Pause. Take Sabbath and remember who is in charge. We are called to challenge the empire, challenge the notion that we have to be the best, have the best things, and keep climbing the ladder. God calls us to be a different kind of community—a place of rest and comfort, a place of renewal and challenge.

My hope, in this busy season is that we remember whose we are. We belong to God. And our God is a God of resurrection. When we reach our own limits, we realize we aren't in charge. And if we fail, maybe then we might see the hope and new life of resurrection. In this time, journeying to Easter, let us change our thinking. Let us take time to rest, pray, and reflect. Let us journey with

Christ to the cross. Peace,

What Jesus wants us to do.

April lessons will be centered on the Easter story. We will begin April by learning about serving others, and that by helping others, we are doing what Jesus wants us to do.
