While I am only twenty minutes away, and I am sure I will see you at Presbytery events, I grieve that I will no longer be your pastor. However, you are getting a fine pastor and person in Brandon. Two years ago, our Presbytery adopted a policy on pastoral transitions to make boundaries clear on what a pastor can and cannot do when they leave. This is important because a pastor saying "yes" after a transition can stunt a congregation's growth under new leadership. If you would like to read the entire policy, I will have Marcia attach it in the E-News for the next few weeks but here's the cliffs notes version. Bob Madsen plans to come and remind the Session about the contents of this policy in the next month or two.

I cannot return to SHPC to serve in pastoral roles such as officiating weddings, baptisms, or funerals. I know this sounds harsh and hard because for ten years, I have loved doing these things, but these things are no longer mine to do at SHPC. I love this church family. Because of that love, I will not get in the way of Brandon beginning his ministry on firm footing.

Kirkin' o' the Tartans Worship & the Launch of the Scottish Reformation Sunday, August 25, 10:30 a.m.

With the procession of tartan banners and the ceremonial grandeur of bagpipes, we commemorate the launch, in late August of 1560, of the Scottish Reformation. The service also includes elements of liturgy and music from Scottish and Celtic traditions, making it distinct from the October commemoration of other Reformation traditions, especially as launched by Martin Luther in the cooler month of October (1517).

Coming this Fall

Conversations with Scripture Sunday School Fall Series

This fall, the Conversations with Scripture Sunday school option returns with three themes that encourage discussion about how scripture can and does relate to our lives and the world today. This small group, intergenerational class, will meet at 9:00 am on Sunday mornings in the Parlor.



We use the PCUSA "Follow Me" series curriculum based on Jesus' practices, actions, and teachings. Written for people of all ages who wish to live out their faith, this curriculum explores where these practices are found in the Bible and how they have been used in Christian faith then and now.

Three series will guide us through the fall and into the Advent season while also being mindful of church wide events scheduled during the Sunday school hour:

"Follow Jesus" looks at Jesus' invitation, following Jesus in community, seeing through the lens of love, and teaching others to follow.

"Worship God" examines how the worship actions we do together shape us to be people following Jesus in the world.

"Do Not Fear" is our Advent series that studies many of the 365 times the phrase "do not fear" appears in Scripture.




Eugenia Gamble's NEW Book
