Dear SHPC Friends,

I love Advent. Advent means "the coming of Christ," and in Advent we celebrate and anticipate Christ coming into our world. I love watching the light grow on our Advent wreath as we approach Christmas. I love the Christmas pageants, the beautiful music on Cantata Sunday, the music by our children, the thoughtful devotions, and Lessons and Carols. Advent is a season of waiting, longing. Often, we can become sentimental during this season settling for "the sweet coming of a baby" forgetting the teaching, ministry, life and death of Christ. Jesus, in the words of Ricky Bobby, becomes simply "eight-pound, six ounce, newborn infant Jesus" or "sweet baby Jesus." We forget the scandal of God coming into the world as a helpless infant. Christ came to turn the world upside down, challenging us to love God and our neighbors.

Our theme this Advent is "The Weary World Rejoices." While there are so many amazing things to look forward to in this season, this time before Christmas makes us weary. There is weariness in mourning the loss of loved ones during a season full of "cheer." There is weariness in feeling lonely and alone, especially during a pandemic. There is weariness in the plight and reality of being human. Yet, even in our weariness, we rejoice. We look to Christmas knowing that love incarnate comes into the world; a thrill of hope catches in our hearts knowing that Christ comes to

make all things new.

This Advent, I am especially excited about our Advent devotionals. This year our devotional is intergenerational and keeps in mind children, youth, and adults. Each day there is something for you to read and sometimes to do including devotions by our church members, Scripture, lighting a candle, taking a walk, writing a letter, coloring, and more. Throughout the season, church members will record their devotions, so you can hear their voice as they share their words. You can find these Advent devotions virtually through our church-wide emails or in paper here at the church. Children, youth, and college students will receive this devotional along with some supplies to help them engage with it deeply.

Look for information in this newsletter to find all kinds of fun during this season of Advent including Cantata Sunday Dec. 5, Adventfest Dec. 11 from 9:00-11:00 am, the Christmas Pageant Dec. 19, Christmas Craze for our youth Dec. 19, and more. We hope in this season you will not lose heart or let your weariness overcome, but may a seed of rejoicing grow in your heart. Indeed the light comes in the darkness.


