DEAR FRIENDS.

With the holidays approaching in my life, there is a whole bunch of preparations—creating schedules, planning time with family and friends, purchasing gifts for loved ones. Preparing is one part of the season of Advent—preparing our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ, But this preparation often

coming of Christ. But this preparation often looks different than the hustling and bustling I usually do. This preparation involves waiting. I rarely sit and just wait— even in "waiting rooms" I have my phone or a book to distract me. If I have to wait too much, I start to get antsy, frustrated, annoyed. Yet, the practice of waiting is an important one. It reminds us that not all of our time has to be structured and accounted for. We can let go of our agendas and to-do lists and wait for something that is not yet, but will come. It also is completely different from our immediate-gratification culture where we can get almost anything with just a click.

The world requires us to wait. We might be able to buy almost anything immediately, but things like joy, peace,

love, and hope don't happen instantaneously. Our bodies do not heal immediately and neither do our souls. If we learn waiting, it builds patience and deep trust. Small moments of waiting help us practice for those crucial moments of waiting and anticipation—waiting for the results of a test, for a new child to arrive, for the world to change, for us to change.

In this season of Advent, practice waiting. Watch water boil. Notice leaves falling. Pause beside a candle. Behold the glow of Christmas lights. Notice opportunities to wait in your everyday life. It is in the waiting that we meet our Lord and Savior.

Children's Ministry

Children's Sunday school and children's church classes will begin December by hearing the story of Micah. Micah told the Hebrews to look toward Bethlehem for a ruler that would bring them peace.

SINGING OUR FAITH: THE POETRY OF HYMNS

A two-part class offered by Randy Sheets, Director of Music Ministries Saturday, January 19 and 26, 11:00 am – 12:30 p.m.

During 2019, the 75th anniversary year of Spring Hill Presbyterian, we will celebrate a practice that is vital in our worship--- congregational song. The first such celebration is a two-part class entitled Singing Our Faith: The Poetry of Hymns. On two Saturdays in January, Randy Sheets will lead interested persons in considering the art and craft of hymn poems. Using hymn poems by writers from different times and traditions, we will look at these topics:

Poetry and Music: what makes a perfect marriage?

Transforming Biblical words to rhythmic, rhymed poetry.

Rhythm, rhyme, and mood—from meditative to jubilant.

Singing What We Believe--- profound theology that we sing together.

The sessions are for anyone who is interested. Just as some of our people did to celebrate our 50th anniversary, some class members may wish to try their hand at writing a hymn poem, which may be presented at our 75th Anniversary Hymn Sing on March 24. As an extension of the class, upon request, Randy will be willing to give feedback to the authors during their creative process.

Recycling spreads the Gospel!

RECYCLING is a big movement these days and YOU can do it also. It may seem a small way, but you can make a big difference in Spanish speaking Sunday Schools in remote areas of USA as well as in Central and South America. It doesn't cost anything, weigh anything and helps to spread the Word of Jesus. How can this happen? Simply cut cancelled stamps off their envelopes and put them in the marked collection box in the Brides Room. Everyone can participate in this effort. The Alliance Stamp Ministry, in which our church has participated for more than a few years, has created a way to raise significant monies solely for the purpose of preparation, publishing and distribution of Christian Sunday school curricula to spread the gospel in Central and Latin America and Spanish speaking denominations in the USA.

Here's how it works: you tear or cut cancelled stamps of any kind from letters, packages, or even foreign correspondence leaving a minimal ¼ inch margin around the stamp(s). The only ineligible stamps are those preprinted on the envelope or from a meter. Yes, even those stamps from nonprofit organizations are valid. Drop them off in the marked box in the Brides Room. Done!! We're all bound to receive an abundance of mail this holiday & year-end season, so keep an eye out and recycle those cancelled stamps.

The stamps go to the Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers, FL, where a cadre of volunteers sort and categorize the stamps which are sold in bulk to stamp collectors anywhere in the world. The current purchase price is \$30 per pound for first class stamps and \$35 per pound for foreign stamps. This ministry which began in 1972 has successfully raised thousands of dollars for the Sunday School Project.

Give your stamps a second life and use them to help spread the gospel especially to children needing to know of God's love. If you have questions, contact Janie Sims 340-6534.


