A Thriving Congregation

Dear Spring Hill Presbyterian Church Family.

Last year, Montreat Conference Center in North Carolina received a sizable grant from the Lilly Foundation to develop a program for the support of congregations in their mission and ministry. Montreat then partnered with the Black Mountain School of Theology and Community to develop something very exciting: the Thriving Congregations Initiative. They launched the initiative last fall by inviting 10 congregations from around the Southeast to participate (free of charge). This initial cohort was developed by Montreat identifying Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations that they considered to be "thriving." The list includes churches from Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and one from Alabama...Spring Hill Presbyteriani What a wonderful external recognition of the great work that this church family has been doing for years!

Each church was charged with putting together a team comprised of the pastor and 4 church leaders. Our team consists of Ryan Mahtani, Edwin Perry, Vera Lynn Sheets, Leslie Sweeney, and myself. Over the 2.5 years of the program, this team travels to Montreat, NC every six months to receive training and to share our work with other congregations. Between these in-person cohort meetings, we also receive coaching and support from the faculty of the program.

The main thrust of the first six-month season is to practice deep, intentional, holy listening within the congregation and the community. Our team has already begun conducting one-on-one listening conversations with members and others outside of our church. In February we will begin holding small group discussion sessions that are open to everyone in our church family. So, mark your calendars for the "BIG WEEK" at the beginning of February when you can participate in this exciting conversation. We will conduct small group listening sessions at the following times:

- -Sunday, February 6 at 4:00 PM.
- -Wednesday, February 9 at noon.
- -Thursday, February 10 at 6:00 PM.

Please sign up for ONE of these sessions, whenever it fits your schedule best. You can sign up in the narthex, hallway or by emailing lsweeney400@gmail.com. During this time, as a church family, we will engage in a process of intentional conversation (for one hour). We will listen for the passion and excitement among our members. We will listen for the energy and momentum of our congregation as a whole. We will listen for how the call of the Holy Spirit is leading us into our next chapter of life together. Our church's Thriving Congregation Team does not come to these meetings with answers, but with questions and a commitment to listen deeply. It is our hope that this process will be both relational and transformational for our church family.

In the weeks surrounding these conversations, we will also launch into a "mini-series" of sermons exploring stories from the Bible when communities and groups were transformed through intentional conversations and holy listening.

I know that God is up to something truly special in this church family, and I am deeply grateful that you are a part of our story of thriving!

Dear SHPC Friends,

Recently, I have been holding onto these lyrics, "Bind us together, Lord. Bind us together with cords that cannot be broken. Bind us together, Lord. Bind us together, Lord. Bind us together with Love." This is my prayer—that God would bind us together, especially right now. While we have been bound together in this community, the pandemic has disrupted our normal patterns. Over and over, we must be bound back together, knitted into the fabric of our faith and community.

Beginning March 6 and continuing throughout the season of Lent (until April 10), we will be bound together in a Common Read, exploring the book *An Altar in the World* by Barbara Brown Taylor. We will divide up into small groups of 8-10 people and facilitators will help guide conversations around this book (our common read). Barbara Brown Taylor will be in Mobile March 27 at Dauphin Way United Methodist, so we will caravan over to hear her. Most groups will meet in person at the church on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am, but we will also have a Sunday morning 9:00 am Zoom option, as well as a mid-week Wednesday evening option (at 7:00 pm). We have recruited facilitators. We have ordered books. Now we just need you to commit be joining us.

This is an opportunity to get to know people in our congregation better or even meet new people—this pandemic has made it hard to be connected to one another, and so it is our hope this Common Read will build community.

An Altar in the World explores spiritual practices in our everyday lives and challenges readers to think how we engage with our faith throughout our daily lives. Taylor asks, "What is saving your life now?" She writes, "No one longs for what he or she already has, and yet the accumulated insight of those wise about the spiritual life suggests that the reason so many of us cannot see the red X that marks the spot is because we are already standing on it. The treasure we seek requires no lengthy expedition, no expensive equipment, no superior aptitude or special company." "In a world of too much information about almost everything bodily practices can provide great relief. To make bread or love, to dig in the earth, to feed an animal or cook for a stranger—these activities require no extensive commentary, no lucid theology. All they require is someone willing to bend, reach, chop, stir." Spiritual practices help us see what it means to be human. Come share and explore how we foster our faith seeing God in the "Ordinary Holy" within our lives. Buz and I will be taking Scriptures from the book to preach throughout the season of Lent. Inspired by Taylor, we are calling this series, "Ordinary Holy." Come see God standing in your midst. Let's take off our shoes, knowing that we stand on holy ground.

Ready to join the journey? Look for our sign-up table before or after church starting Jan. 30 and continuing through February to sign-up and buy the book (\$10). Also check out the flyer in the newsletter.


