#### Dear Spring Hill Presbyterian Church Family,

As I write this final newsletter article, I am keenly aware that the anxiety around transition is thick in the air. We have packed our house, moved our belongings, and are navigating the logistics of our family being in multiple locations. At the church, many committees and other groups are moving into a summer break, knowing that the fall will bring some new patterns and new people into the leadership of our congregation. As we wade through these days of liminal space, there are three things I want to address with you:

1. Timeline: Here is a general overview of what to expect in the coming weeks.

- June 5 (Pentecost)- Our Faith & the Arts Summer Sunday School series begins.
- June 12 (Trinity Sunday)- My last Sunday in the pulpit.
- June 15 My last day in the office.
- June 15-30 Stephen Ministers are prepared to make pastoral care visits if needed and local pastors are prepared to officiate any funerals that may occur.
- June 19 & 26- Rev. Bob Madsen, our Regional Presbyter, will preach in worship.
- July 1 Dr. Cary Speaker begins his service as our Interim Pastor.
- July 3- Dr. Speaker's first Sunday in the pulpit.
- July 10 Lawrence Hughey will preach for this year's Spring Hill Sunday.
- August 15- Dr. Anna Fulmer Duke, our Associate Pastor, returns from sabbatical.
- September 11- Rally Day kicks off the fall programs at church.

**2. Ethics of Pastoral Transition**: While the timeframe above gives you a sense of *when* things are occurring around this time of transition, I also want to say a word about *how* we will navigate these waters. First, let me assure you that I will continue to be completely focused on serving as your Senior Pastor until my last day in the office (June 15). This includes not only ordinary pastoral responsibilities, but also documenting and passing on as much institutional information as possible for future church leaders to access.

Once the transition occurs and I am no longer serving as your Senior Pastor, please know that I will still keep you in my prayers, in my heart, and in my memory. I will look forward to following your success as a church family, to seeing how your kids and grandkids grow, and to rooting with you (or against you) when our favorite teams take the field. From afar, the bonds of friendship will remain.

However, the pastoral nature of our relationship will no longer remain. This means that I will NOT be returning to serve in pastoral roles such as officiating weddings, baptisms, or funerals. While emphasizing and maintaining this clear boundary may sound harsh or unloving, it is actually the exact opposite. BECAUSE I love this church family so much, I will not get in the way of the next Senior Pastor (and Interim Pastor) beginning their ministry on firm footing. BECAUSE you welcomed me in with wide open arms, I will not deprive the next Senior Pastor of the opportunity to receive the same warm hospitality. It is unfortunately the case that sometimes pastors have such a hard time letting go that their desire to please others and say "yes" after a transition can stunt a congregation's growth under new leadership. While I deeply love so many of you in this church family, after this transition, that love will need to be expressed in the role of a friend, not that of a pastor. I have spoken to our Session about this important ethical boundary, and they have heard from the leadership of our presbytery as well about how clarity concerning these matters is an important gift to the successful beginning of your next Senior Pastor's ministry. I have already begun the process of lovingly saying "no" to folks when they ask about upcoming baptisms, weddings, and (thankfully, yet to be planned) funerals. So, please know in advance that we will continue to be clear when such questions arise in the future. **Holy Memory**: Finally, as we move through these days of saying goodbyes and final moments together, know that I am so full of gratitude for the holy moments that we have shared over these past eight and a half years together. I will hold these memories forever. As you've heard me say (far too many times) "*Our memories become the mentors of our hopes*." Thus, full of holy memories, my hopes for the future of this church family are strong. Because I remember how God has molded you throughout your years, I am hopeful that God will continue to call you to be a loving, serving, thinking, singing, leading, and learning family of faith. I can't wait to see what God has in store for you next!



#### Dr. Cary G. Speaker

I grew up in Birmingham; graduated from Woodlawn High School and Samford University. After graduating from Columbia Seminary in Decatur, Ga in 1976 with a DMin, I returned to Birmingham for Clinical Pastoral Education at the Baptist Medical Center – Montclair. My first call was to Roanoke, VA as an associate pastor for Christian Education and Youth Ministry. Sally and I met and married while in VA. In 1981, two weeks after we were married, we moved to Tuscaloosa, AL, where I was a staff chaplain at DCH Regional Medical Center. Both of our sons were born during the Tuscaloosa years. I fell in love with Mobile and the hospitality of the people. I am looking forward to ministry with the congregation during this transition. You are a healthy church with a bright future. Of course, much of that is due to the leadership of your clergy. Buz will be missed. But the best way a congregation can honor its former pastor is to continue the mission and ministry that was begun while he was with you.

I will move and get settled the last week of June. I am excited to be in worship with you on July 3, 2022.


