Breaking the Chains: A Family-Friendly Lenten Devotional

When things heat up

Dear Friends,

It's amazing to see all the fun that is ahead in the month of March. From a baby shower, Festival of Faith, VBS registration opening, the Easter Egg Hunt, Confirmation Retreat, and Youth Sunday, I am excited for all that this month will bring! The youth are already deep in their planning for Youth Sunday; they will be preaching and writing liturgy on the same theme as our Lenten series, "Release to the Captives." They are studying the story of Shadrack, Meshack, and Abednego from Daniel 3. It's an amazing story. Shadrack, Meshack, and Abednego are sent to Babylon during the exile-they are given new names. Shadrack, Meshack, and Abednego are their new Babylonian names. They are told they must conform to the empire, but they resist in small and large ways. They refuse to worship the king's idol and are thrown into a fiery furnace. They are thrown into the furnace bound but immediately whether because of the fire or God's providence, their chains come loose. The guards see them walking around in the furnace but with a fourth figure—God. They survive.

Throughout our lives we face pressure to conform, to fit in, to worship false idols. The story of Shadrack, Meshack, and Abednego teaches me about faith that is willing to face death, trust in God that holds us together when things heat up. During this season of Lent, with so much before us, it is easy to become distracted-to only focus on the tasks at hand. May we stop and pause to give thanks to our God who breaks our chains, who frees us to be in relationship with God.

I hope you will be there on March 22 to be led by our youth in worship. The stories they have to tell will inspire you and remind you of our God who walks with us through fire. Grace and Peace,
