

What's Happening with the Current Issues Class in November?

Join us at 9:00 in Fellowship Hall or online with Zoom as we explore the following newsworthy topics and our Christian response:

Nov. 3: Voting – A non-partisan guided conversation. What are your earliest memories about voting as a part of your family's experience? Who ran for president the first time YOU voted? Do you consider voting to be more of a "sacred right" or a "civic responsibility?" Dale Hair will guide the conversation with questions that promote active listening and storytelling strategies within the class.

Nov. 10: Danny Rickert, Chief Policy Officer and VP for Medical Affairs at USA Health – The State of Healthcare in Alabama (Hospitals, Medicare, Medicaid, and anticipated legislative issues to come.)

Nov. 17: Final follow-up to Eugenia Gamble's book *Tending the Wild Garden, Growing in the Fruit of the Spirit*. Today's conversation will focus on the aspects of Faithfulness and Gentleness. You do NOT have to have read the book or heard Eugenia's presentation to participate in the conversation. Andy and Judy Falls will lead the discussion.

Nov. 24: The Ethics of AI – Finding our path as Christians in a world of intelligent machinery. Explore and discuss some key ideas from articles in Presbyterian Outlook, March, 2024.
