REFORMATION ECHOES

DEAR SPRING HILL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FAMILY,

If you've been by the church the last few weeks you've been hearing us talk quite a bit about the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. For Protestants, this is quite a birthday! We've been marking the occasion with a sermon series, Sunday school classes, and other educational events. The reformers championed certain ideals which historians later referred to as the Five Solas (because of the Latin words used in their names). Here at SHPC we have our own ways of embodying those ideals in our life together.

"Sola Scriptura"- Scripture Alone. The reformers believed that the Bible, not human traditions and superstitions, should be the guide in structuring our lives of faith. At SHPC, holy Scripture serves as the foundation for our worship life. All that we do is oriented toward God's word. This month our worship will be full of many celebrations of God's word in action such as World Communion Sunday (October 1), Presbyterian Women Sunday (October 8), Dedication Sunday (October 15), and Reformation Sunday (October 29).

"Sola Gratia"- Grace Alone. The reformers placed a strong emphasis on the truth that we are saved only by God's grace, not by any actions that we do. This did not mean that they were opposed to "good works" such as supporting the church and ministering to those in need. Rather, these actions are our grateful response to God's Grace. This month at SHPC we invite you to respond to God's grace with prayerful pledges to financially support the work of the church in the coming year. Of course these "good works" are not earning or buying God's favor. Rather, they are our thankful response to God's grace.

"Sola Fide"- Faith Alone. Reformers like John Calvin understood that faith (our trust in God's love) is both "revealed to the mind and sealed upon the heart." At SHPC we strive to provide opportunities for growth in our faith throughout the course of life. Our faith and love grow through opportunities for fellowship, worship, service, and study. In addition to our many Sunday schools and Bible studies, this fall we have begun a midweek Bible study led by our pastors to equip and enable more of our Church family to connect both the mind and the heart. Join us Wednesdays at noon in the Fellowship Hall for this class

"Sola Christus" – Christ Alone. Rather than being dependent on a priests or self-serving church hierarchies to sense a strong connection to God, Martin Luther talked about the priesthood with all believers. John Calvin and John Knox developed new systems of church government in which the members of the church governed as elders. Our church's active elders, deacons, and committees work hard to equip and empower all members of the congregation to lead. This fall our new class of officers is hard at work training for to lead us together into the future God has prepared for us.

"Sola Deo Gloria"- to God alone be the Glory. Rather than seeking to serve our own power, status, prestige or glory, the reformers understood that the purpose and meaning of life is to give glory to God alone. The mission statement of Spring Hill Presbyterian Church is an intentional and direct to echo of these rReformers work and words: "To glorify God and make disciples who witness and serve."

Dear Friends,

We are in the midst of our Fall series, "Back to the Source" –and this time has helped me see how important it is to talk about the essentials of our faith. We are continuing this throughout October, with words such as: tithe, freedom, call, prayer, and church. I hope that this theme, becomes a rallying cry for you as well, in your own life—a challenge to go back to Scripture, back to God, to assess your life and priorities.

Our world demands our time. Everything often becomes a priority until nothing is a priority—it is all an emergency. We often are tired, overworked, stressed. We need Sabbath. We need rest. We need to go back to our source, to be renewed, refreshed, and energized. We need space and stillness and solitude. We need time for prayer. We need a moment to be centered in who we are and who God is. This doesn't mean leaving the country for two weeks to reassess your life—it means taking a moment, a minute to be still, to listen for God's voice, to go back to our source.

One of the ways that I invite you to go back to the source is to learn a little bit about our Presbyterian History. Join us on **Oct. 29 at 9 am for our Reformation Pageant**. We will tell the story of the Reformation through stories and skits. It will be a fun, interactive time where both children and adults can learn a little more about our heritage. Hear about the Widow of the Reformation, Luther's sassy and smart wife, Katharina, Calvin, and more!

if you are a parent with a child, we hope you will come back to the source and discover something new about communion in our **Communion Training Class on Oct. 15 at 9 am. This class is geared for children 1st-5th grades.** We will see how volunteers prepare communion, learn why we take communion, and so much more. Come with your questions and challenges. This will also be the Sunday where our second graders will receive Bibles during the Children's sermon.

Additionally, on Thursday, October 26 from 5:30-7 pm, we are hosting our second annual "Trunk or Treat." Members of our church (including, I hope you!) will band together in groups or as families and decorate their trunks based on a theme. Do you love Alabama or Auburn? Decorate your trunk with that in mind! Were you a witch or ghost in a former life? Decorate a spooky trunk! Can you read fortunes? Maybe your trunk needs to have a mystical side! On Thursday, October 26, we will have food trucks here on site beginning at 5:00 pm (for those with trunks and decorations), then at 6 pm, we will open our trunks and invite kids to come trick-or-treating on our lawn. Children will come to your trunk to trick-ortreat. It is our hope that this will not just be a churchwide event, but a community event, a way that we can open our trunks and doors to our larger community.

Jesus said, **"whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."** This may just seem like another thing to commit to, or another item to add onto your calendar. However, it is my hope that you can see the potential for this to be an opportunity for you to meet and welcome Jesus. Join us as we welcome superheroes, animals from throughout the world, princesses, ghosts, and maybe even Jesus himself.

God does not call us to a life of to-do lists, stress, and fear; but to a life full of joy, fun, and maybe even some crazy costumes. Join us as we remember who God is and who we are called to be! Peace.
