# BACK TO THE SOURCE

### DEAR SPRING HILL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FAMILY,

This fall we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the

beginning of the Protestant Reformation. The reformers (like Martin Luther, Ulrich Zwingli, and John Calvin) sought to correct the abuses and heresies of the Medieval

Church by returning to the beginnings of our faith story. They used the witness of scripture and the example of the early church as their authorities in matters of faith and life together. As a fitting way to honor their memory and follow their wisdom, this fall we will begin a series of worship services and church-wide events entitled, "Back to the Source." This phrase in Latin "Ad Fontes" (literally "back to the fountain") was a rallying cry used by those reformers to remind their churches to turn back to the source of scripture as their guide. So too will we be examining what the Bible actually teaches about many concepts, doctrines, and vocabulary of the faith that we may take for granted today. Each Sunday, our worship service will be built around a particular word that is important for our Christian faith. Also, each week our Affirmation of Faith used in worship will come from a different confession written during the 1500's. Learning from the wisdom and witness of our forbearers in the

# A Vocabulary of Faith

## Dear Friends,

This year, something big is happening on October 29 —and no, its not just my 30th birthday! We will be celebrating the 500th anniversary of Reformation here at Spring Hill Presbyterian with a Reformation Pageant (like a Christmas Pageant, but with Reformers) and the Kirkin of the Tartans. Throughout the Fall, we are remembering the Reformation, with our theme, "Back to the Source."

Each week we will be looking at a word from our faith —like church, saint, communion, sin, grace, and more. We are going back to the source—Scripture to see what these words truly mean from the reformed tradition. "Back to the Source" was a rallying cry during the early parts of the Reformation. It is my hope that it will stir something new and exciting within us as well.

It is my hope that this isn't just the theme for peaching and worship in the fall. It's my hope that you will talk to your families and friends about the words we use and what they mean. It's easy to use words around children (and even adults) and assume that they know what you mean and the words you are saying. But often, our words miss the mark, and they fall short. I invite you to create a "Vocabulary of Faith" notebook with your children, spouse, or a friend, and add to the list each week a new word. Talk about the complexities of the words—see if your understanding of a word grows or changes.

This Fall, we will have eight 7th-8th graders (and one 9th grader) begin confirmation. Confirmation is a time when we intentionally explore the words of our faith and what they mean to us. Confirmation is a time that is "setapart," where we remember our baptism—the promises that our parents and community made and take on those promises ourselves.

I think our Fall theme, "Back to the Source" is an adult version of Confirmation. It's a time where we get to explore the words we use, the things that we believe, and grow closer to God.

Many of our Sunday schools are using this theme of "Back to the Source" to shape their classes by studying Scripture, studying reformers, and more, so what you hear in worship is what will be discussed in other classes. We hope that you will try something new this fall, and explore our great Sunday school opportunities. Our Fall Schedule will kick-off with Rally Day on **September 10!** Grace and Peace,

### A Little time makes a Big Difference

Several weeks ago, Pastor Buz preached a sermon on Surprise (God's Surprising acts) and Teaching. Would it be a surprise to you to know that you are a teacher although that may be the farthest thing from your mind to be—but you teach by being a role model. Would it be a surprise for you to know that you are a gift-to the teachers as well as the students?
