I come back from this time refre shed and renewed, excit ed to be with you, e specially as we discern in this wilderne ss time God's plans for our church. May we continue to adventure into the future, going beyond the wilderne ss, turning aside to behold burning bushe s and miracle s beneath our feet.

This Fall, we have so many opportunitie s to engage in ministry together. I can't help but look forward to this in anticipation and hope. I hope you will join us, **Sept. 11 at 9:00 am for a Rally Day potluck breakfast** to explore how you can grow in your faith. Maybe Sunday School is something you don't normally do or have gott en out of the habit of — I encourage you to go beyond the wilderne ss and try something new.
